


## A City Wakes Up Inside Me: Recent Paintings by Nayanaa Kanodia

In her recent suite of paintings, Nayanaa Kanodia presents wry portraits of women and couples, set in domestic interiors melded from the actual and the fictive, and cityscapes in which imagined panoramas are stacked against existing vistas to produce the idea of a city that is both a model of civic order as well as of the site of architectural and psychic enigma. Kanodia's art proceeds from several points of departure, including the 19th- and early 20th-century genres of the formal studio portrait and the carte de visite. She manages to internalise exoticism and strangeness, not as vivid mannerisms for their own sake, but as wacky symptoms of the displacement of the accepted social roles and places of her protagonists. Consider the woman in a couple languidly discovering her erotic potentialities; or the woman asserting herself in a dominant, conventionally masculine pose, leaning on an umbrella with a dog for company, for all the world like a Habsburg emperor in a classic piece of dynastic portraiture.

In her choice of pictorial language, Kanodia also explores a domain that has largely dropped out of sight, so far as contemporary art-making is concerned. Her art continues a preoccupation with retrieving miniature and popular vocabularies of image to render metropolitan experience, beloved of such painters as the once well known Vajubhai Bhagat, who fell into a most unfortunate gap: they were too stylised to suit either academic realism in late colonial India or the School of Parisoriented Progressives in early postcolonial India.

Set squarely in the secular realm of boudoir and drawing room, her figures can nevertheless suggest archetypal, even iconic presences: the woman attended by a lion is an example, as are the women surrounded by props suggestive of domestic felicity or worldly accomplishment. Such figures come across as everyday goddesses of the metropolitan whirl of routinisation and social role-playing, seemingly regular yet marking surprising disruptions from the hidden rimlands of dream and fantasy.



## A City Wakes Up Inside Me

About her new series 'A CITY WAKES UP INSIDE ME' where she has captured Mumbai, Nayanaa Kanodia says, "Mumbai - the city of dreams and opportunities was shattered on 26/11 2008 and held to ransom by a bunch of terrorists challenging the nerve of the city. The burning city fired her creativity. She adds "In our daily hustle and bustle, we let the unplanned and haphazard building development mire our heritage monuments. Monuments grow old, naturally, but on a scale of time that is much greater not only than the span of human existence but also than the passing of a whole series of generations. Therein lies the significance of a city when seen against the grand flow of time itself".

These paintings are a fabulous harmony of yearning and concrete detail, the coincidence that is, of a willful dream and reality experienced at first hand. We get the impression that the heavily painted structural surfaces are seething and exhaling their own aroma. Her power to perceive her surroundings only through the prism of her imagination, to set imagined symbols side by side on a surface, is massive and primal. The cheerfulness is coupled with mystery and the sublime becomes a joking matter.

Nayanaa's work has been done on two levels viz. the exterior and the interior and the results have to be seen to be believed. It is the sum total of her desires and preoccupations to search beneath the obvious, literally and figuratively, to paint dramas that are at play with everyday environments which lead to unraveling a complete story within the frame. This series shows the importance of the city in our daily existence and understanding the metamorphosis in the social and architectural makeup of a metropolis. It is a microcosm of our world at large. Her work portrays emotionally charged moments of seemingly ordinary people faced with their day-to—day situations. Human elements are placed provocatively against a background of entire streets/cities. We have a soul within a soul. The interiors have people living their lives and emotions and the cities breathing their own existence. Static scenes lend movement to the images.



Nayanaa Kanodia can be considered to be the pioneer of L'art Naïf in India. She completed her graduation form Lady Shri Ram College, New Delhi in Economics-Honours. She won the National Scholarship of the Government. An economist turned painter, Nayanaa is entirely a self-taught artist except for a year's apprenticeship with Anjolie Ela Menon.

She had her first solo show in Mumbai in 1986 and has held numerous exhibitions since then in India and abroad. In 1998, she was selected from all the Commonwealth countries by .The Commonwealth Institute for a solo show in their newly renovated complex in London. In 2001 she was invited by the Victoria and Albert Museum, London to exhibit her work and to give a demonstration of her painting technique. She has also participated in many group shows nationally and internationally including the ones in New York in 1988; National Gallery of Modern Art, Mumbai in 1997 & 1998; Dubai in 1998; London in 2001, 2002 & 2006; 'Centre Regional D'Art Contemporain', Sete, France in 2001; Washington in 2001; Paris in 2002; Hong Kong in 2005; Singapore in 2006; 'The Ueno Royal Museum', Tokyo in 2007; South Africa in 2007. Nayanaa is the first Indian of non-British origin whose works are in the collection of the 'Paintings in Hospitals', UK previously named as British Museum. Nayanaa's work is held in many public and private collections in India and abroad including the Musée International d'Art Naïf, Paris. She has also conducted Art Camps in India and abroad. Her work also features in several auctions of Indian Contemporary Art internationally. She lives and works in Mumbai.
